

Who are we?

We assist BULLMASTIFFS from shelters, pounds, homes where they are unwanted, and from abusive situations. All BULLMASTIFFS are carefully checked by a veterinarian, vaccinated, tested for heartworm (and treated if necessary) and neutered. Our BULLMASTIFFS are taken into foster care by the rescue volunteers and are provided with training, nurture, and temperament evaluation. We screen our prospective homes with great care, and require an adoption agreement be signed by the new adopter.

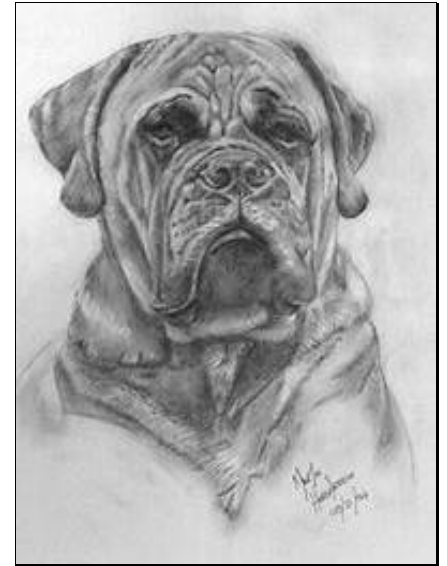

What does the BULLMASTIFF look like?

Here is a depiction of the typical BULLMASTIFF:



Standard Size:

Height is measured from the withers:

Dogs: 24-27 in Weight: 100-130 lbs

Bitches 24-26 in Weight: 100-120 lbs

Coat and Color:

Coat short and dense.

Color: any shade of red, fawn (shown here), or brindle.

White markings on the chest may exist.

The most distinguishing characteristics of all BULLMASTIFFS are:
